

### Bright Voices of the Darkest Hour: Music and the Holocaust

March 4, 2017, 7 pm at the Community Music Center

In the history book of humankind there are pages we would rather turn and forever forget. They make us uncomfortable; but however unpleasant, it is our responsibility to remember so the dark pages of our history do not repeat themselves. The devastating history of the Holocaust, the genocide by the German Nazi regime during the Second World War, is certainly one of the darkest pages in history.



We cannot change the past or the fate of over 6 million Jews and millions of non-Jews that perished, but we can learn about the passion for life from composers whose music became their profound weapon of resistance. We can learn from the young Czech composer, Gideon Klein, who was confined in a Theresienstadt concentration camp, the talented Dutch composer Leo Smit, who perished in Sobibor, and the prolific composer Hans Gal, who was forced to flee his native Austria in order to survive.

Given what we have heard about life in the concentration camps, why would anyone spend time and energy writing or playing music? Music is part of survival, part of the human spirit and essential for life. Through the power of music we say, "I am alive, and my life has meaning". On March 4th, Portland Chamber Music will pay special tribute to the music and composers whose lives were affected or cut short by the Holocaust.

By learning their stories and listening to their musical legacy, we can keep our hearts open and remember how important it is for the human existence to accept others despite race, religion or cultural background.



### **How Music Affects All of Us**

My background is in occupational therapy, and a focus of this practice with children is in helping them learn to regulate their bodies and energy levels.

There is a program called the Alert Program, or "How does your engine run?" (www.alertprogram.com) which teaches children to understand the differences in their own level of energy, or alertness, and helps them gain awareness on how to adjust their energy levels to adapt to different parts of their day. For example, a particular level of focus is needed for learning math, and likely during PE another, higher level of energy will be required.

A facet of the Alert Program is a CD of music, with different tracks offering children the opportunity to feel and experience the various levels of alertness. I've personally used this CD with a group of children with sensory deficits (www.sensory-processingdisorder.com/) and witnessed their movements slow to the low-toned, dirge-like track. The music prevented their ability to continue in a hyperactive state, and allowed them to participate more fully in classroom tasks. It was remarkable to witness, and there is growing evidence of support for this program in current research.

Music can have a potent effect on mood, attention, and focus. I am so proud to work with Portland Chamber Music, an organization that recognizes this potential, and aims to offer this opportunity to all people, of all ages and of all demographics.

I hope you will join us for our upcoming concerts, an offering sure to please your senses not only with lovely music but also a community with whom to connect.
