

to sing? During that concert we – the musicians – felt the most profound connection with every single person in the audience. It was for certain: together we were grieving; together we were searching for new hope; together we were looking for confidence and optimism within ourselves. At the end of the night I could see hope in people's eyes and many came up to give us hugs. **Music heals.**

Do you have a favorite song or maybe a favorite melody? Some people might find your choice silly, but when this particular tune comes on, your most cherished memories are back. It makes you smile, inspires some bold dance moves and even changes your mood!


